2025 brought exponential growth to the Widows program, both by equipping leaders and by reaching more women than ever before. Connection remains at the heart of the program, with small group gatherings continuing to be a cornerstone of meaningful support and community.

Whether gathering in living rooms, meeting at church, or connecting online, community remains as the heart of the program.

The Widows program also expanded its reach through the use of YouVersion as a tool for broader impact. Through six devotional plans created in 2025, widows in more than 151 countries were reached and offered hope and encouragement.

In addition, the Widows Toolkit continued to grow with the development of new resources. In 2025, the program added a new curriculum, a Pastor's Guide, a First-Year Ministry Guide, and a Retreat Guide—further equipping churches and leaders to serve widows with excellence and care.





EAST COAST CONNECTIONS

SITGM for Widows is reaching both near and far. The program currently partners with 55 domestic churches and 10 international church partners, spanning 23 states and 5 countries. In addition, 46 community organizations are actively connected within the Widows network.

In 2025, the Widows team traveled to serve and support partners in Ohio, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Virginia. We believe proximity matters, and that being present in person provides a unique level of encouragement, care, and support.

These travels strengthened relationships with our partners and reaffirmed our commitment to walk alongside widows and leaders—wherever God opens the door.

LIFE LAUNCH MISSION

Life Launch walks alongside young adults as they build stability, confidence, and a vision for their future. Through church partnerships, committed mentors, and practical support, mentees experience consistent, life-giving relationships that foster confidence and self-respect.

KEY PARTNERS

Partnerships with Hope Fellowship Church and Grace and Peace Presbyterian Church expanded our reach and strengthened local impact. Life Launch was also featured during Spotlight Sunday at Life Church South Broken Arrow, increasing awareness and engagement. Additionally, growing interest from Phoenix Rising connected

us with more potential mentees seeking guidance, accountability, and encouragement.

PRESENCE DURING CRISIS

During the SNAP benefit pause, mentors and volunteers delivered groceries to meet practical needs with dignity and compassion. Even beyond the 12-month commitment, mentors continued to show up as Life Launch graduates applied what they learned and pursued meaningful goals—reminding us that when someone believes in you, it can change everything.

LAYERS OF SUPPORT

In 2025, Stand in the Gap continued its mission to empower women in prison through the Women in Transition program. Designed to address the complex challenges incarcerated women face, the program provides multiple layers of support—including structured curriculum, life coaching support for re-entry, and mentorship—creating a holistic pathway for healing, growth, and rebuilding life after incarceration. Graduates are experiencing lasting transformation, pursuing education and professional training, earning promotions, stepping into leadership roles, raising their children, and so much more.

CURRICULUM LAUNCH

This year marked the full launch and completion of the Women in Transition curriculum, a 21-course program created specifically for women in prison. The curriculum addresses critical topics such as trauma, co-dependency, addiction, forgiveness, and personal responsibility, offering a structured path toward lasting change and renewed hope. Thanks to the generosity of Williams, who printed the curriculum, these life-changing materials are now in the hands of women who need them most.



LOCKING ARMS WITH SHEBREWS

Our partnership with SheBrews is a vital part of providing women transitioning from incarceration with safe housing, job training, and holistic support. Located in Claremore and Tulsa, SheBrews offers security and stability for 32 women, each of whom is paired with a Stand in the Gap Women in Transition mentor team.

Rhonda Bear serves as the Program Director for SITG Women in Transition and the Executive Director of SheBrews. Her leadership is deeply informed by her own lived experience and her firsthand understanding of the life-changing impact these programs can have.


